Benefits of Pairing

Children can learn to:

- ask for the specific sensory strategy they need
- comment on the sensory input they are receiving
- give feedback to their helper
- report if something feels good or bad
- ask for more or repetition
- adjust frequency of sensory input
- request a different/new strategy
- advocate for themselves
- **report** if something is working or not working that day, in that moment (this can vary day to day and moment to moment)
- develop self-awareness skills
- communicate WITHOUT behaviors
- initiate communication with others
- build language skills
- learn where sensory vocabulary is on their communication device
- share their opinion on their favorite sensory strategy
- **discover** the power of their words, and how words can help them get what their body needs to stay regulated throughout the day
